ATTENTION ALL ACTIVE MEMBERS: YOUR CCPOA FAMILY LEGAL PLAN JUST GOT A WHOLE LOT BETTER.

"What legal plan?" you say. "I didn't sign up for anything. I'm not paying for that!" Well, good news. Just by being an active CCPOA member, the plan is already yours and there is no monthly out-of-pocket to you. It is our Family Legal Plan, you get it from the Trust and it is managed by U.S. Legal Services.

START WITH THE BASICS

If you are not yet familiar with the plan then here are the basics:

- The plan is a pre-paid legal plan. This means that on the majority of services you pay little or no fees.
- The plan includes a number of common everyday legal services that people can really use, such as Document Preparation and Review, Power of Attorney and even Traffic Violations.
- There is no out-of-pocket membership fees for all Active members. Retired CCPOA members can join for only \$13.99/month.

THE UPGRADES

In an effort to serve our members better the Trust has negotiated some benefits that relate especially to our members.

Last year, we added coverage for Concealed Carry / Use of Deadly Force. This includes up to 25 Hours of legal representation, including: a Skelly Hearing and representation with the California State Personnel Board (SPB).

This latest round of enhancements and upgrades features four great additions:

Domestic Violence Defense: This service covers representation for Covered Persons in defense of domestic violence charges. Representation includes court hearings, injunction hear-

ings, restraining orders, and disposition where the Covered Person is the defen-

dant.

Re-Turning a Blind Eye

"Blindness is a private matter between a person and the eyes with which he or she was born." - José Saramago

The unbroken black of a dead TV screen is how many people with normal vision imagine blindness, but about 90 percent of people who are designated as legally blind have some degree of remaining sight.

Developed by a research team in the United Kingdom at a University of Oxford lab, SmartSpecs, use 3D cameras originally developed for the Xbox to capture real time images. A built in computer amps up the contrast, and are projected in front of the viewers eyes. Dark things go black, while bright things become white. To reduce visual clutter, far away objects are simply erased.

The high contrast allows many visually impaired users to see things they normally couldn't. Doorways are enhanced. Furniture that might not stand out becomes bright white. Even a blurry face turns into crisp black and white cartoon.

The Oxford neuroscientist leading the project, Stephen Hicks, commented "All you need to do is get a few bits and pieces of an image and your brain fills it in,—you just need a bit of shadow here and there, like walking around your house by moonlight."

Using about 100 testers, the team has been testing prototypes for about four years. No bulky computers are involved. SmartSpecs hopes to become the first to make a high-tech, vision-enhancing device, that is completely portable.

So far, only about a third of the users find the glasses help to some degree, but the experience can be life-changing for those who do benefit.

One of the early testers of SmartSpecs, Hannah Thompson, is a legally blind British academic. On her blog, she describes how SmartSpecs allowed her to shop for food in a busy market.

"The first thing that struck me as I looked at the cheeses on display was







that I could, for the first time ever, distinguish their different shapes and sizes," she writes.

Navigating low-light situations, or in dappled sunlight—wherelight and shadow can make it very tough to discern edges of objects, are just two more instances of where the glasses could help.

Britain's Royal National Institute of Blind People is working in conjunction with the Oxford team. The team won the 2014 Google Impact Challenge, (a contest for innovative solutions to the issues faced by people with disabilities), where they were awarded close to three-quarters of a million dollars.

"Our real focus is on a pair of glasses that approach something people wouldn't feel too self-conscious to wear," says Hicks. Many competing devices are much larger and require carrying a bag containing the processor.

Since eye contact is such a big part of human interaction, part of making glasses look less off-putting is designing them so the user's eyes are visible. SmartSpecs have tinted, sunglasses-like lenses that leave the user's eyes visible, while the cameras are mounted above. That way users don't have such a robot-like look about them.

The next step will be equipping the glasses with Siri typesoftware, which can automatically recognize different types of objects. This would allow users to say "glasses, find me a chair," and the glasses would identify chair-like objects in the vicinity.

"We're trying to make something that actually is a desirable thing for people to be able to wear," Hicks says. "You can make the best thing in the world, but if it makes no sense to wear, it's not very useful."

Healthy Aging

WHAT IS HEALTHY AGING?

Getting older is a natural part of life. How you will feel as you get older depends on many things, including what health problems run in your family and the choices you make. If you take good care of your body and learn positive ways to deal with stress now, you can slow down or even prevent problems that often come with getting older.

It's never too early or too late to change bad habits and start good ones. No matter when you start, a healthy lifestyle can make a difference in how you feel and what you can do.

WHAT DETERMINES HOW HEALTHY YOU WILL BE AS YOU GET OLDER?

The changes you'll go through as you get older depend on a number of things. One is your family history (genetics). If your family members have diseases or ongoing (chronic) health problems like high blood pressure or diabetes, then you may have a greater chance of having those problems yourself. But just because your risk is higher, it doesn't mean you will definitely have the same problems. In fact, the lifestyle choices you make can help reduce your chances of getting illnesses that run in your family. And even if you do get a family illness, choosing to be physically active, to eat healthy foods, and to learn how to deal with stress can keep the illness from destroying your ability to enjoy your golden years.

WHAT KINDS OF CHANGES SHOULD YOU EXPECT AS YOU AGE?

Changes as you get older are usually gradual. Certain physical changes are common. Your metabolism (how fast your body can burn calories) slows over time, which means that your body needs less food energy than before. How much and how well you sleep will likely change. Most people start needing reading glasses around age 40, and many have some hearing loss later in life. Starting in your 50s, bone aging increases. Also starting around age 50, you may notice changes in sexual function - it's normal to have a slower sexual response.

Most vital organs gradually become less efficient with age. The kidneys are less able to keep enough water in your body. And the heart can start to show signs of wear and tear. So as you get older, it's important to be physically active, drink plenty of water, and choose healthy foods. Doing these things will help your body work well for a longer period of time.

WHAT DO YOU NEED TO DO TO FEEL YOUR BEST AS YOU AGE?

One of the most important things you can do for your health at any age is to be physically active. Physical activity keeps your body strong, and it helps with how you feel. People who stay active are less likely to get depressed. Physical activity can be anything from walking to gardening to working out at the gym. The important thing is to be active almost every day. No matter what your age or condition, there is a type of physical activity that's right for you. Always ask your doctor whether it is safe for you to start a physical activity program.

Advance Directives—such as a living will and a medical power of attorney—can ensure that you will get the care you want if you become physically or mentally unable to make your own medical decisions.

A **Living Will** states your wishes about your medical care. A **Medical Power of Attorney** gives a person you choose (your health care agent) the authority to make medical decisions for you if you become unable to make these decisions for yourself.

In addition to putting your advance directives in writing, also be sure to clearly communicate your choices to all family members who might be involved in your health care in the future.

*Editor's Note: Advanced Directives are included as part of the CCPOA Legal Plan.

Your mental and emotional health are also important. Protect or improve your emotional health by staying in touch with friends, family, and the community. People who feel connected to others are more likely to thrive than those who do not. And try to keep stress at a minimum. In addition to getting regular physical activity, you can take charge of how stress affects you by taking 20 minutes a day to just relax.

To protect or improve your memory and mental sharpness, keep your brain active and challenged. Learn or do something new and different. For example, attend an educational workshop or learn a new card game. Depression can be a serious problem for older adults. If you think you may be depressed, seek help antidepressant medicine and counseling can help treat depression.

Unfortunatly for Simons, basking in his glory of a \$60 haul didn't last long. Seems he had overlooked one crucial factor. Simons had bought the mask from the same gas station shortly before, and hadn't been in disguise at the time.

Better still, he was also the only person to have ever bought it. It didn't take long for police to find him on the security tape. Simons got five years. walesonline.co.uk


What's Up with the 4-1-9?

Named after the Nigerian Penal Code for fraud, you are about to meet the biggest name in 419 scams.

We have all seen the email, a Nigerian prince who needs a hand, and a willing bank account, to transfer millions of dollars to. And you get 30% just for helping out.

While it seems dubious that anyone would still fall for this today, back in 1995 this style of scam grabbed over \$200 million in a single con.

Meet Mr. Emmanuel Nwude, who according to his Wikipedia page, is a former director of Union Bank PLC (one of the largest commercial banks in Nigeria) and one of the most notable "advanced fee" fraud artists to ever come out of the country. Between 1995 and 1998 he successfully



conned someone who you think would have been a bit more skeptical—Nelson Sakaguchi, a Director from *Banco Noroeste*, one of the five largest banks in Brasil. It became the third biggest fraud/crime in banking history.

THE SCAM

As a banker and former director of Union Bank of Nigeria, his position made him privy to some links, information and documents. Hence, Emmanuel Nwude impersonated Paul Ogwuma, then Governor of the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) and persuaded Sakaguchi to invest in a new airport in FCT, Abuja, in exchange for a \$10 million commission.

The attractive commission was enough for Sakaguchi to agree to pay \$191 million in cash and the remainder in the form of outstanding interest.

It wasn't until 1997, when *Banco Noroeste* was in negotiations to merge with another bank, *Spanish Banco Santander*, that the fraud came to light.

In a joint board meeting, officials from Santander inquired about why two-fifths of Noroeste's total value and half of their capital, was sitting unmonitored in the Cayman Islands.

THE AFTERMATH

In 2004 Nwude and his cohorts were all arrested and charged in the Abuja High Court with 86 counts of "fraudulently seeking advance fees" and 15 counts of bribery related to the case. Only a year later he tried using his considerable wealth and influence to bribe the head of the Economic and Financial Crimes Commission, with \$75,000 cash. He was also charged in the attempted kidnapping of a prosecution witness.


He was convicted by the courts after a prolonged legal battle (after all, with that kind of money a man can hire the best lawyers and try to twist the legal process) which even involved the court being evacuated for a bomb scare, and sentenced to 25 years.

The story does not end there... In May of 2015 it seems his lawyer successfully argued that the sentence given to him was "unknown to law" and not contained in Act establishing the offence. He also argued that Nwude was made to forfeit some assets that he acquired before the offence was committed.

He was released from prison after serving only about one year, and was able to reclaim at least \$52 million in assets.

You might think that after having such a stroke of luck, Nwude would just lay low and spend his ill-gotten gains in peace, but no


DEATH TO HIV

New antibody attacks 99% of HIV strains

Our bodies struggle to fight HIV because of the virus' incredible ability to mutate and change its appearance, but science has finally gotten closer to a magic bullet.

In a collaboration between the US National Institutes of Health and the pharmaceutical company Sanofi, researchers have engineered an antibody that attacks 99% of HIV strains and can prevent infection in primates.

Because of the HIV virus' incredible ability to mutate and change, our bodies struggle to fight it. This means a single patient can have many variations-or strains- of HIV at the same time. So the immune system finds itself in a fight against an insurmountable number of strains of HIV. Interestingly, the flu virus tends to do the same thing.

SUPER-ANTIBODIES

After years of infection, a small number of patients naturally develop "broadly neutralising antibodies." These powerful weapons attack something fundamental to HIV and can kill large swathes of HIV strains.

Researchers have combined three such antibodies into an even more powerful "tri-specific antibody."

The best naturally occurring antibodies will target 90% of HIV strains, "We're getting 99% coverage, and getting coverage at very low concentrations of the antibody," said Dr Gary Nabel, the chief scientific officer at Sanofi.

Scientists at Harvard Medical School, The Scripps Research Institute, and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology all participated in experiments using 24 Monkeys. None of those given the tri-specific antibody developed an infection when they were later injected with the virus.
